Herkimer College Course

Students should choose one major and complete as many recommended courses below as needed to fulfill program elective requirements. St. John Fisher University requires students to take a minimum of one-half of the major courses at Fisher.

American Studies - BA	Choose up to six courses from the following with no more than two courses from each of the following three groupings: 1. SS 185, 186; 141, 241, 247. 2. EN 123, 133, 217 3. SS 121, 122

Legal Studies – BA	Choose courses of student’s choice and second major interest.
Mathematics – BA/BS	MA 245, 246, 247, 251, 254, 262.
Modern Language – BA	Spanish FL 101, 102; Course in another language
Philosophy – BA	HU 151, HU 158
Physics – BA Physics – BS	MA 245, 246, 247, 251; SC 233, 234. MA 245, 246, 247, 251; SC 233, 234. Recommended: One course from SC 155; SC 153
Political Science – BA	SS 141, 142, 145, 246.
Psychology – BA/BS	MA 127; SS 151, 152, or 240, 153, 155, 235, 236. One PHL and Natural Science course each.
Public Health – BA/BS	MA 127, SC 211, SS 255, Spanish 101, 102
Public Relations - BS	BU 112, 141; EN 225, 228; HU 165
Religious Studies – BA	Courses of student’s choice
Sport Management - BS	BU 112, 114, 115, 141, 250, 254; IS 115; SS 186; MA 127
Sustainability - BA	SC 116, 258, SS 186

Recommended: Fulfill remainder of associate degree requirements. Choose courses from major listing to fulfill major elective requirements for your program of choice. BA degree candidates need to show *language proficiency*. Students can fulfill the requirement by either having transfer credit for language at the 112 level at Fisher, taking course(s) at Fisher to complete at the 112 level or by taking a language proficiency test through the department of Modern Languages at Fisher that demonstrates proficiency at the 112 level. The proficiency test does not result in academic credit, as this is not a credit requirement. Transfer coursework will result in academic credit.
